<b>Subject matter:</b>	<i>Exchange of views on the planned revision of the Consumer Protection Cooperation (CPC) Regulation</i>
<b>Main points raised and positions expressed:</b>	<p><i>The Commission recalled the reasons behind its plan to revise the CPC Regulation in the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter of 2026 as highlighted in its 2030 Consumer Agenda, including the possibility of centralised investigation and enforcement powers at EU level in specific cases and how to further strengthen coordination among national authorities under the CPC Regulation.</i></p> <p><i>Vzbv asked questions on how the planned revision of the CPC Regulation would affect the enforcement of consumer law in Germany, which predominantly relies on private enforcement by entities having a legitimate interest in protecting consumers (e.g., vzbv) or competitors.</i></p>
