AFRICA

CAR: SG reports on the situation in CAR and MINUSCA

Resolution [2759 \(2024\)](#) of 14 November 2024

Para. 58(a): Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Council on 15 February 2025, 15 June 2025 and 13 October 2025 on the progress in implementing MINUSCA's mandate, including efforts towards compliance with the Status of Force Agreement, as well as on the situation in the CAR, including on all elements set out in paragraph 58 (a) of resolution [2659 \(2022\)](#);

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in February 2025.

Libya: UNSMIL: SG to report to SC on the implementation of resolution [2755 \(2024\)](#)

Resolution [2755 \(2024\)](#) of 31 October 2024

Para. 13: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Security Council on the implementation of this resolution every 60 days;

The Secretary-General is expected to report in February 2025.

Sudan: SG to report on UN efforts to support Sudan (UNSCR [2715 \(2023\)](#)) and the implementation of UNSCR [2736 \(2024\)](#)

Resolution [2715 \(2023\)](#) of 1 December 2023

Para. 7: Requests the Secretary-General to provide a written report in 90 days, and then brief the Security Council every 120 days on UN efforts to support Sudan on its path towards peace and stability, and to keep this reporting under review;

Resolution [2736 \(2024\)](#) of 13 June 2024

Para. 9: Requests the Secretary-General to report on the implementation of all elements of this resolution within his regular updates as stipulated in resolution [2715 \(2023\)](#);

The Secretary-General is expected to report in February 2025.

South Sudan: SG report on implementation of the UNMISS mandate and obstructions

Resolution [2729 \(2024\)](#) of 29 April 2024

Para. 24: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Security Council on implementation of the UNMISS mandate and the obstructions UNMISS encounters in doing so in a comprehensive written report to be submitted within 90 days of the date of adoption of this resolution, every 90 days thereafter, and underscores that such reporting should provide integrated, evidence-based and data-driven analysis, strategic assessments and frank advice to the Security Council and should include attention to: [...]

AMERICAS

Haiti: SG to provide a comprehensive assessment on current context and options for UN role

PSC letter of 29 November 2024 (S/2024/868)

Second para.: The members of the Security Council request that you provide for their consideration, within the next 60-90 days in consultation with all relevant Haitian stakeholders, the Multinational Security Support (MSS) mission, regional and international stakeholders, including Council members, and the United Nations Integrated Office in Haiti (BINUH) and the United Nations Country Team in Haiti, a comprehensive assessment of the current Haiti context and on-going UN and international efforts, and strategic-level recommendations with a full range of options for the possible role that the UN can play in this regard, incorporating lessons learned from previous UN missions, political developments in Haiti, and the current MSS mission, with a view to a long-term perspective to sustain security and stability in Haiti, addressing the root causes of the crisis.

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in February 2025.

ASIA/MIDDLE EAST

Afghanistan: SG reports on UNAMA

Resolution 2727 (2024) of 15 March 2024

Para. 5: Requests that the Secretary-General reports to the Council every three months on the situation in Afghanistan and the implementation of UNAMA's mandate, including at the subnational level;

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in February 2025.

The situation in the Middle East, including the Palestinian question

Para. 7: Invites the Secretary-General to continue to follow the situation and to keep the Security Council informed.

Middle East (Syria): OPCW DG to report to SC (through SG) on implementation of resolution 2118 (2013)

Para. 12: Decides to review on a regular basis the implementation in the Syrian Arab Republic of the decision of the OPCW Executive Council of 27 September 2013 and this resolution, and requests the Director-General of the OPCW to report to the Security Council, through the Secretary-General, who shall include relevant information on United Nations activities related to the implementation of this resolution, within 30 days and every month thereafter, and requests further the Director-General of the OPCW and the Secretary-General to report in a coordinated manner, as needed, to the Security Council, non-compliance with this resolution or the OPCW Executive Council decision of 27 September 2013.

Middle East (Yemen): SG to report to SC on implementation of resolution 2742 (2024)

Para. 2: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Security Council on a monthly basis on progress regarding the implementation of this resolution, in accordance with paragraph 8 of resolution 2643 (2022);

PSC Letter of 15 May 2007 (S/2007/280)

I have the honour to inform you that your letter dated 7 May 2007 (S/2007/279) concerning your intention to establish a United Nations Regional Centre for Preventive Diplomacy in Ash gabat has been brought to the attention of the members of the Security Council. They take note of the information contained in your letter and the intention expressed therein, and invite you to inform them about the activities of the newly established Centre and its impact on the ground. They would welcome receiving such a report, for example, six months after the Centre becomes fully operational.
