Foreword



In the framework of European integration, access to the legislation of the European Union and its Member States as well as to that of the EFTA countries has become ever more important. In order to facilitate this access, the Publications Office of the European Union created the experimental N-Lex website as a single access point with a common search interface to national legislation in, currently, 23 EU Member States.

In parallel, the Publications Office issued some general information on the legal gazettes of the EU and EFTA

Member States and on those of the EU candidate and potential candidate countries (*Directory of legal gazettes in Europe* — 2006, 2007 and 2008 editions). However, as this information represents only a fraction of the wealth of detailed data which have been collected at the Publications Office in this context, there was a strong demand to compile and update these data and to make the information available to a wider readership. This guide aims to satisfy this need, and although it is intended for professional readers, it may also be of interest to the general public.

The compilation of this guide would not have been possible without the active assistance of the organisations responsible for the national legal gazettes which, together, form the European Forum of Official Gazettes. They have updated the information to reflect the situation as at spring 2009 and revised the chapters concerning their respective activities. If, despite our best efforts, you discover errors or omissions, kindly let us know, we will then correct the information in the online edition of the guide on the website of the European Forum of Official Gazettes (http://www.forum-official-gazettes.eu).

Introduction

Lawyers and policymakers have always needed to consult legislation other than their own, and the globalisation of our national economies and legal cultures makes this requirement even greater. This is particularly true for Europe where the process of economic and political integration has led from the three Communities of the 1950s to today's European Union and its extension, the European Economic Area. In the countries concerned, access to European and foreign legislation has therefore become a regular need.

In former days when legal information and documentation was based on the traditional methods of paper collections and indexes, generally speaking until the early 1970s, the task of providing access to all relevant foreign legislation was an impossible mission. It would have been beyond the means of a single institution to maintain collections of the legal gazettes of 20 or 30 different countries, not to speak of updated collections of the law in force in these countries. It was therefore quite natural for the European Commission to take a particular interest in the new technology of legal data processing in the late 1960s, as this technology promised to revolutionise legal documentation and to simplify the access to European and national legislation. This interest resulted in the early creation of the legal information system CELEX on European law (now EUR-Lex) in 1969/70 and the setting-up of the Council Working Party on Legal Data Processing (now e-Law) in 1974 as an observatory and discussion platform for legal documentation at EU and Member States level.

Unfortunately, it soon became apparent that many of the early expectations of this new technology would not become reality in the foreseeable future and that, in particular, the creation of a centralised cross-border access to the law of the Member States still remained a utopian vision at that time. Nevertheless, the Commission and the other European institutions maintained a keen interest in the development of legal databases in the Member States and, among other activities in the field of legal information retrieval, carried out two major studies:

- a technical study on legal information retrieval, 1977–78 (1),
- a study of the access to legal databases in Europe, 1985–86 (2).

In addition to these important studies, three major projects concerning cross-border access to law were undertaken respectively by the Commission and by the Publications Office:

- Eulegis, 1998–2000 (proof-of-concept project: prototype for a single access point to national and EU legislation in Europe);
- EULEX, 1998–2002 (demonstration and pilot projects: direct access to national legislation implementing European directives);

• N-Lex, 1999–2005 (formerly Nat-Lex, sub-project of the EULEX projects: implementation of a common interface to legal databases in Europe, opened to the public on an experimental basis in 2006; see Annex 2).

The publication of this guide is in line with the aforementioned activities. In some respects, the guide may be considered as a follow-up, 25 and 30 years later, to the studies of 1977 and 1985, insofar as it updates the earlier descriptions of the framework and conditions of access to the various online repositories for legislation in Europe. Details of the objectives and coverage then and now differ, of course: the old Commission studies concerned public and private sector databases and examined these services primarily as regards what today we would call their 'usability', which was the crucial issue for all legal databases in those days. This guide, on the other hand, covers only official services, and no longer addresses the question of usability, as all legal online services nowadays have modern, web-based user interfaces.

A reader comparing the findings of the studies of 1977 and 1986 with the current situation as described in this guide would be impressed by the enormous changes which have taken place in the meantime. In fact, the conditions for accessing domestic and foreign legislation online have improved dramatically since the early 1990s.

The main reason for the progress is, of course, the technological development since then, with its revolutionary effects on online databases in general (graphical user interface and web technology) and on legal information systems in particular: whereas in the 1980s, and even until the mid-1990s, legal databases had complicated, user-unfriendly search interfaces and were, therefore, exclusively targeted at, and designed for, professional intermediaries, such as documentalists and information officers, today's web-based legal online services are designed for the (occasional) end-user.

The second major change concerns the 'policy context' of legal information retrieval: whereas in former days legal databases were seen as mere document search tools for the legal profession, they have now become part of the information policy of e-government. The main consequence of this paradigmatic change has been the doctrine of free access to online legal information services. The fact that until the mid-1990s all legal databases were subscription based, constituted, as the EULEX and Nat-Lex (N-Lex) projects clearly showed, an even greater obstacle to cross-border access than did the diversity of the complicated user interfaces. Today, most official legal databases are free of charge and are therefore accessible to the general public.

These changes are best illustrated by briefly recalling the history of the online editions of the legal gazettes/official journals: they were among the first legal websites created since the second half of the 1990s, and most of them were initially operated as stand-alone services with subscription-based access. Over the next few years, nearly all became free of charge and many of them were integrated into the existing legal online databases — which became free of charge as well. In addition, many online gazettes/official journals have changed their function, namely from an auxiliary information tool for legislation to an authentic medium for the official publication of newly adopted laws. In more and more countries, these authentic online editions are even replacing the traditional paper gazette: the legal gazette/official journal is becoming paperless.

This guide can only provide a snapshot of the current conditions for accessing legislation in the 33 jurisdictions it describes, and the abundance of details may be rather confusing for a novice. The latter should, therefore, keep in mind the broad tendency outlined above. The expert reader, however, will be enthusiastic about the picture which emerges from the guide: one of the earliest objectives of computerised legal information retrieval has, at last, become reality: cross-border access to foreign legislation — although still not trivial — is, in fact, no longer a technical problem.

Note to the reader

This guide provides general information on the legislative sources of the following legal systems:

- the European Union (EU) and its 27 Member States;
- the European Economic Area (EEA) and the four Member States of the European Free Trade Association (EFTA).

Each section is subdivided into the headings described below.

1. LEGAL GAZETTE

There is some confusion as to what a 'legal gazette', an 'official journal' or an 'official gazette' is. The terms are often interchanged without any apparent reason. There are languages where this difficulty does not exist: for example in German there are distinct terms, i.e. *Gesetzblatt* (legal gazette) and *Amtsblatt* (official gazette). For the sake of terminological uniformity, in this guide:

- 'legal gazette' denotes a (separate) official periodical for the publication of newly adopted legislation;
- 'official gazette' stands for a (separate) official periodical for the publication of legal notices and other official texts:
- 'official journal' denotes a single official periodical containing 'legal gazette' and 'official gazette' parts.

This choice has been inspired by the names used for official publications in English: in the United Kingdom and in Ireland there are the London Gazette, Edinburgh Gazette and Belfast Gazette and the Irish State Gazette as the official gazettes of record for documents other than legislation, and at the EU level there is the Official Journal of the European Union for the publication of both legislation and legal notices.

NB: There are no gazettes for legislation in the United Kingdom or in Ireland, but only collections of the legislation produced within a year. However, as the term 'legal gazette' is sufficiently self-explanatory, it is used in this guide for the continental official periodicals that contain exclusively legislation.

1.1. Overview

Names of Because of the terminological uncertainty discussed above, the original the official names of the official publications and of the institutions responsible are **publication and** translated word-for-word into English. This translation may sometimes of the publishing differ from the English translation used in the country itself (e.g. in organisation the quide, the name of the Lithuanian legal gazette Valstybės žinios is translated literally as 'State news' although the website of this legal gazette indicates 'Official Journal').

Official journal/ In this field, the nature of the official publication is explained, using the legal gazette terminology described above. Of the 33 official publications mentioned in the guide, there are:

- 17 single 'official journals',
- 13 separate 'legal gazettes', and
- 3 official collections of legislation. For details, see Table 1(a) in Annex 1.

First edition The establishment date of the current publication is indicated. In some cases, additional information is mentioned, such as earlier publications of a similar nature or the fact that the publication of the legal gazette was suspended for historical reasons. Of the 33 official publications described in this guide:

- 22 were issued before 1945, and
- 6 have been issued in the period since 1990.

First online edition This is the date of the launch of the online service — not to be confused with the date from which the legal gazettes have been available online. (The latter date is indicated below, under the heading 'Online edition'.)

> It is interesting to note that 20 out of the 32 online editions existing to date were set up between 1995 and 2000, with 12 already operational in the course of the first three years of this period.



Paper edition

The annual subscription price is indicated. This price varies from EUR 48 (Bulgaria) to EUR 2 500 (Iceland).

This heading also contains information on the availability of semi-official or private paper collections in the, currently (1 July 2009), seven countries that have already abolished the official paper edition. (See Table 1(a) in Annex 1) In these countries the user can, of course, print copies

This heading also indicates whether the paper and/or the online edition is 'legally binding. For an explanation of this term, see point 1.2.

Online edition

Details on the coverage of the online edition are given in this field. This coverage normally starts on the date when the online version was set up in the mid-1990s or later (14 services), but many legal gazettes have scanned all or large parts of the editions published prior to this date (18 services).

Under this heading, it is also indicated whether unlimited access to the online edition is free of charge. (This is the case for 31 legal gazettes; see Table 2 in Annex 1.)



CD/DVD edition

CD or DVD editions are available in 17 out of the 33 legal systems (see Table 1(a) in Annex 1)

Some services offer, on demand, a special CD/DVD containing a compilation of the items that are of specific interest to the client.

1.2. Details on the legal gazette in general

Content This heading gives an overview of the main content of the relevant legal gazette/official journal. In cases where this content has been summarised in terms of 'primary legislation' (basic/parliamentary legislation) and 'secondary legislation' (subordinate/delegated legislation), the former denotes laws and other legal acts adopted by the parliament and the latter corresponds to acts adopted by the empowered authorities, often governments or ministers. NB: In European law, these terms have a different meaning; see this heading in the chapter on EU law.

Legal basis This heading provides the reference to the legislation governing the setting-up and the operation of the legal gazette/official journal.

Legally binding Is the paper edition or the online edition the authoritative version of the legal gazette/official journal?

Taken literally, this question and also the title of the heading do not make much sense, at least not in most continental legal systems, in which it would be the task of the judge to determine whether the text version of a law presented by one of the parties corresponds to the legislation in force (an emanation of the principle which considers that it is the judge who knows the law: iura novit curia). What is actually meant by 'legally binding' is the following: in continental legal systems, one precondition for the law to enter into force is its prior official publication. Therefore, the guestion is: if the paper version cannot be issued in a timely manner, is the publication of the text of law on the Internet sufficient to fulfil the constitutional precondition of its prior official publication? (See also the informative judgment of the European Court of Justice of 11 December 2007 — Case C-161/06 Skoma-Lux [2007] European Court Reports (ECR) I-10841).

NB: For the situation in common law countries, see this heading in the chapter on the United Kingdom.

Financing In the past the publication of the legal gazettes/official journals has been primarily financed by subscription fees. As the number of subscriptions has fallen dramatically since the online editions became free of charge, more and more legal gazettes/official journals have to be financed directly by the state budget (see Table 1(a) in Annex 1).

Other gazettes Other official publications are mentioned under this heading, in particular 'official gazettes' in the sense defined above.

> For countries with a federal state structure (e.g. Germany, Austria and Switzerland) or with autonomous regions (e.g. Italy and Spain), the existence of sub-national legislation is mentioned, but access to this legislation is not described.

1.3. Details on the online edition

Functionalities Some services offer special functionalities such as downloading, hyperlinks from citations (cross-references) to the sources, or awareness services.

Format description In 27 of the 32 online editions, the texts are available in PDF; many of these services offer other formats as well.

Authenticity The workflow measures which ensure the technical authenticity are mentioned under this heading. This technical authenticity must not be confused with the question of whether the online edition is 'legally binding. There are countries where the online edition is considered to be (technically) authentic, without being 'official' or 'legally binding'; see also the explanations under the heading 'Legally binding' in point 1.2.

Archiving Most services offering the online edition of the legal gazette do not have any specific archiving system but use normal backup operations.

1.4. Details on the publishing institution

Form and nature Twenty-one publishing organisations are part of the central state administration, six are other public sector organisations and six are private sector companies acting on behalf of the state administration; for details see Table 1(b) in Annex 1. As regards the state authority responsible, 11 institutions belong to the services of the prime minister, 11 organisations are part of the administration of the Ministry of Justice, four belong to parliament services, three to the administration of the Ministry of the Interior and four to other authorities.

> NB: As far as private sector companies acting on behalf of a state authority are concerned, it has sometimes been difficult to establish whether these organisations are sufficiently autonomous to be mentioned in this guide as the 'publishing body' or whether they should be simply considered as (anonymous) contractors.

Basic tasks These headings summarise the core business (paper and/or online publishing of the legal gazette, consolidation work, running of a legal Other services database, publishing of legal notices and other official documents) offered as well as possible ancillary activities (book publishing, bookshop, helpdesk, etc.), see Table 1(b) in Annex 1.

1.5. Drafting and publishing procedures

Text processing The headings of point 1.5 are intended for specialists working in the system field of official journals and legal databases. The European Forum of Official Gazettes has paid special attention to these subjects; see the list Workflow of reports in Annex 3.

One of the interesting results the reader can find here is the relatively **Publishing** substantial number of 11 legal gazettes/official journals (out of 33) where publishing is the final step in an integrated workflow system.

2. COLLECTIONS OF CONSOLIDATED LEGISLATION

This section concerns only **official collections** of updated ('consolidated') texts of law. The commonly used loose-leaf collections published by the private sector were therefore not included. However, the updated texts themselves can be unofficial — which, in most cases, they are (see the statistics below, under the heading 'Status of the consolidated texts').

In English, the meaning of the legal term 'consolidation' is ambiguous, because it can also denote the law-making action of the legislator, by which the old act and its amendments are repealed and the updated version is adopted as a new act. In civil law systems, this action is generally referred to as 'codification'. Therefore, taking the Irish 'consolidation acts' as an example, these acts would be considered as 'codified acts' in continental European systems.

This section concerns only **non-legislative consolidation** ('consolidation' in the continental sense of the term, i.e. by official institutions other than the legislator). The status of this informal consolidation can be either semi-official, e.g. when the consolidated texts are published in the legal gazette, or unofficial, 'for information purposes only.' The latter is generally the case for (official) legal databases containing a consolidated version of the legislation.

This section only covers **systematic consolidation**, i.e. the updating of all texts of law currently in force. Therefore, it does not mention the ad hoc consolidation of frequently amended and important acts that is carried out, from time to time, by ministers (or, for example, in Poland by the Chancellor of the Parliament) on the basis of a mandate given by the legislator. The texts of these ad hoc consolidations are published in the legal gazette but, as they do not constitute a collection of legislation in force, they are not taken into consideration for this guide.

For 27 (out of the 33) legal systems, at least one official collection of consolidated texts exists. In 25 systems, this collection is available online. For details, see Table 2 in Annex 1.

Body carrying out In 18 cases, the consolidation work is carried out by the institution consolidation which publishes the legal gazette.

Content A few collections are limited to primary (parliamentary) legislation; most of them, however, contain both primary and secondary (delegated)

legislation.

Status of the The status of the consolidated texts is indicated according to the consolidated texts information provided by the organisation responsible. In most cases (19 collections), consolidation is issued 'for information purposes only' and in only eight cases are the consolidated texts considered as 'official'/'semi-official'. For details, see Table 2 in Annex 1.

Deadline for Where available, information is provided on the time lapse between the publication of the amendments and the availability of the consolidated text of the amended act.

3. LEGISLATIVE PORTALS AND ONLINE DATABASES

3.1. Official portals

The concept of what a portal is remains rather open in this guide. Therefore, services containing few links are mentioned when the organisations which operate them consider them to be portals. On the other hand, databases are included when they contain a sufficient number of additional links. The database is then mentioned twice, in points 3.1 and 3.2.

3.2. Official databases

This guide does not distinguish between, on the one hand, traditional legal databases which generally have a deep search structure, i.e. detailed metadata per document and, on the other hand, legal websites with a flat search structure, e.g. full-text search only. However, the online edition of the legal gazette has normally not been included in this point, as it is already described in point 1.3. An exception is only made, and the legal gazette mentioned in point 3.2, where the latter is part of the legal database.

Access via N-Lex N-Lex is the single access point with a common retrieval interface for cross-border search of legislation in EU Member States; for details, see Annex 2. This heading indicates that the database in question is used or is planned as a target service for N-Lex.

Organisation Many (26) of the publishers of the legal gazette online are also responsible responsible for running the official legislation database; for details, see Table 1(b) in Annex 1.

Content Under this heading, the content of the database is outlined and it is indicated whether the legislation is available in consolidated form (which is the case for 25 databases); for details, see Table 3 in Annex 1.

Access Most official databases (29 out of 35 — some countries have several official databases) can currently be accessed free of charge; for details, see Table 3 in Annex 1

3.3. Additional information: other commonly used legal databases

In spite of the ever-increasing importance of public sector databases, subscription-based private sector services play an important and, in some countries, even predominant role in providing information on domestic law to the legal profession. This is particularly true for information on case law and legal literature but it also applies, although to a lesser extent, to legislative information. We have therefore tried to include in Section 3 the names of private sector services. As this additional information goes beyond the scope of the guide, the alphabetical lists may well — despite our best efforts — be incomplete. Any errors brought to our attention will be corrected in the online edition of the guide, which will be available on the website of the European Forum of Official Gazettes (http://www.forum-official-gazettes.eu).

1.2. Details on the legal gazette in general

Since the distribution of texts to the two series has not been fixed by a legal act, it has changed over the years — the current distribution is as follows:

- L series (legislation): EU secondary legislation (regulations, directives, decisions, opinions, recommendations) and sometimes primary legislation, i.e. treaties (authentic only in the national legal gazettes of the Member States concerned);
- C series (communication): EU information and notices (preparatory acts, announcements, summaries of judgments of the Court of Justice, written parliamentary questions, annual reports of the Court of Auditors, statements from the Economic and Social Committee and the Committee of the Regions, calls for expressions of interest for EU programmes and projects, public contacts, etc.); primary legislation (treaties).
 - The C ... A series (C-Annex) contains competition notices for recruitment by EU institutions and common catalogues of varieties of agricultural plant species. It can be ordered separately. The C ... E series (C-Electronic) of the series, which has existed since 1999 (first number C 247 E), available only online (see point 1.3), contains preparatory acts in the legislative process (i.e. the list of Commission proposals no longer the full text Council common positions, and minutes of the sittings of the European Parliament).
- S Supplement: calls for tenders (public contracts for works, supplies and services from all EU Member States, public contracts from EU institutions, European Development Fund contracts and others). Since 1 July 1998, the Official Journal S has been replaced by the online database TED (Tenders Electronic Daily http://ted.europa.eu) which is also available on CD-ROM.
- The EEA Supplement contains legal texts concerning the European Economic Area (EEA) which have been published in the Official Journal L or C, in Icelandic and Norwegian (http://www.efta.int/content/publications/EEASupplements), see the chapter on EEA law in Part II of this guide.
- The Annex contains the debates (*verbatim reports of the proceedings of the sittings*) of the European Parliament, Article 173 of its Rules of Procedure. It is available in the 'Activities' section of the Parliament website (http://www.europarl.europa.eu/activities/plenary. do?language=EN) and in five cumulative DVDs per year.

Linguistic versions According to the accession dates of the respective Member States, the Official Journal has been published in the following language versions:

- since 1952: in Dutch, French, German and Italian;
- since 1973: also in Danish and English;
- since 1981: also in Greek:
- since 1986: also in Portuguese and Spanish;
- since 1995: also in Finnish and Swedish:
- since May 2004 also in Czech, Estonian, Hungarian, Latvian, Lithuanian, Maltese, Polish, Slovak and Slovenian;
- since 2007: also in Bulgarian and Romanian.

Since 2007, legislation adopted according to the co-decision procedure is also published in Irish. Primary legislation, i.e. treaties, has also been adopted in Irish since 1973 in a special Irish version of the Official Journal, published only in book form.

Texts from 1952 that were still in force at the respective accession dates are, in principle, also available as part of the special editions published in the framework of these enlargements.

Legal basis The Official Journal of the European Union is based on the legal provisions stated in Article 254 of the Treaty establishing the European Community and in Article 163 of the Treaty establishing the European Atomic Energy Community, as well as on the decisions of the Councils of the European Economic Community and of the European Atomic Energy Community of 15 September 1958 creating the Official Journal of the European Communities (Official Journal No 17, 6.10.1958, pp. 390 and 419).

Linguistic versions As far as the different language versions are concerned, the availability of the PDF editions of the Official Journal is as follows:

- since 1998 for the Danish, Dutch, English, Finnish, French, German, Greek, Italian, Portuguese, Spanish and Swedish editions;
- since May 2004 for the Czech, Estonian, Hungarian, Latvian, Lithuanian, Maltese, Polish, Slovak and Slovene editions, including the special editions containing the texts of the acts of the institutions and of the European Central Bank adopted before 1 May 2004 and still in force at that date:
- since 2007 for the Bulgarian and Romanian editions, including the Special Editions in these languages, as well as for the Irish edition. The texts published in the Official Journal, including most texts prior to 1998 — within the limits described in point 1.2 — can also be accessed (in PDF, TIFF and/or HTML formats) using the search functions of the EUR-Lex database (see point 3.2).

- **Authenticity** A study was conducted in 2007 on measures to be taken in order to guarantee the integrity of the workflows and to ensure the authenticity of the electronic edition of the Official Journal.
 - A task force has been created to undertake actions required in order to provide the electronic edition with a date and time stamp and an electronic signature during the course of 2009.

Archiving An external service provider manages the electronic archive, under the supervision of the Publications Office. The archiving process includes all official gazettes (in TIFF/PDF format) and takes place after publication of the electronic edition.

The Publications Office is an interinstitutional body governed by a management committee (see Decision 2009/496/EC, Euratom of 26 June 2009 on the organisation and operation of the Publications Office of the European Union; an amendment is currently under way), in which each institution is represented by its secretary-general or, in the case of the Court of Justice, by the Court's Registrar. The Committee meets several times a year and is responsible for the strategic orientations of the publication of the Official Journal. 1.2. Details on the legal gazette in general

Content The *Belgisch Staatsblad/Moniteur belge* is divided into four parts:

- Part I: laws, decrees, ordinances and regulations (pertaining to laws on federal and non-federal levels), some court decisions
- Part II: other acts such as royal and ministerial decrees on all levels (federal and non-federal)
- Part III: official/legal notices
- Part IV: other legal information and communications

Legal basis In Belgium, the legal basis for publishing legislation is defined in various legal provisions, given that the Belgisch Staatsblad/Moniteur belge publishes for several institutions. The most important are the Belgian Constitution, the Act of 31 May 1961 on the use of languages in legislation and the procedure of publication, the special law of 8 August 1980 on the reform of the Belgian institutions and Articles 472 to 478 of the Programming Act of 24 December 2002, amended by Articles 4 to 8 of the Act of 20 July 2005. The latter lays down the current publication and distribution procedures (limited number of paper copies and distribution via the Internet).

Legally binding

Public distribution has been carried out exclusively online since 1 January 2003. Only five official paper copies of each gazette are produced (for the Ministry of Justice, the Belgisch Staatsblad/ Moniteur belge, the National Library, the National Archive and one for microfilming). Nevertheless, the competent authority considers that these five paper copies are the legally binding version. Other paper copies are produced on demand (see point 1.1 for price details). Further to a decision of the now Constitutional Court (Grondwettelijk Hof/Cour constitutionnelle), a free-of-charge helpdesk for facilitating access to the online edition was created on 1 August 2005. Since 15 October 2005 almost every courthouse has had to make paper summaries of the Belgisch Staatsblad/Moniteur belge available to the public.

Other gazettes Separate legal publications exist for provinces and other levels. For example, the provinces publish their regulations and ordinances in an official publication called Bestuursmemoriaal/Mémorial administratif. Despite the country's federal structure, all legislation, federal and regional, is published at the centralised level of the Belgisch Staatsblad/ Moniteur belge.

1.5. Drafting and publishing procedures

Text processing Drafting and adopting legislation is the responsibility of the various system parliaments and governments. Some of them use template-based software; others work with standard office packages. For this reason, there is no unique system for primary and secondary legislation.

- **Workflow** There is no single integrated electronic workflow system for drafting, adopting and publishing legislation. The publishing body receives information in several text and image formats. Part of the information is delivered on paper.
 - The publishing organisation converts these formats into Xyvision layout files and exports them as PostScript and HTML files. The PostScript files are then converted into PDF files for online publishing.
 - The HTML files are used in the underlying 'full-text search' database.

- **Publishing** The department introducing the publication reguest (administrations, parliaments, etc.) checks the final proofs before publication. In the case of extreme urgency and for texts of minor importance, proofreading is carried out by the publishing organisation.
 - The individual texts are grouped in a publication prepared one day in advance. It is possible for several editions to be published on the same day. In urgent cases, publication can take place within two hours of reception of the text by the publishing organisation, depending on the volume and complexity of the text.
 - The paper edition is derived from the electronic PDF edition, which ensures that both editions correspond exactly.
 - After publication, some text files are recovered to be used in the 'consolidated legislation' database of the Ministry of Justice (see point 2).

 - According to Article 10(2) of Act No 309/1999, the legislation must be published immediately. The time needed for publication depends, however, on the volume of legislation and the printing house's capacity. The time may vary from 1 to 30 days, which is the statutory deadline for publishing. From a technical point of view, the minimum period is around 24 hours.
 - Printing of both collections is carried out by the printing House of the Ministry of the Interior.
 - Electronic and paper editions are derived from the same file and published on the same day.

2. COLLECTIONS OF CONSOLIDATED LEGISLATION

For the time being, there is no official collection of consolidated legislation available, but a system of publication of legally binding electronic and paper editions of acts in consolidated form, called e-Sbírka (e-Collection), is being prepared. Part of the project is to create a freeof-charge online database containing the consolidated versions of both valid and derogated acts that have been published since 4 May 1945. Nevertheless, the official portal (see point 3.1) gives access to consolidated legislation acquired by the Ministry of the Interior from a commercial company (see point 3.3).

- **Text processing** Specially designed text processing systems are used for: drafting bills (Office of the Attorney General); amending bills and publishing acts of the Oireachtas (Houses of the Oireachtas); processing statutory instruments (Government Supplies Agency).
 - Different, but related, systems are used for primary and secondary legislation.
 - Bills are drafted using Word templates and converted to XML. XML editors are used for processing bills, acts and statutory instruments.

Workflow One system is used for drafting legislation. A separate system is used for adopting and publishing legislation. The draft legislation is sent electronically and on paper and converted into XML.

- **Publishing** The Office of the Houses of the Oireachtas is in charge of proofreading and editing.
 - The period between reception of the draft and availability of the published text is two days.
 - The paper and electronic editions are derived from the same final text file and are published at the same time.

2. COLLECTIONS OF CONSOLIDATED LEGISLATION

At present no official collection of consolidated legislation exists, but there is an activity of ad hoc consolidation (restatement). Consolidated texts are published on the Irish Statute Book website (http://www.irishstatutebook.ie).

Body carrying out Law Reform Commission (an independent body established under the consolidation Law Reform Commission Act 1975) took this task over from the Office of the Attorney General (http://www.lawreform.ie/).

Content Restatements

In Ireland, the consolidation activity is called restatement and is based on the Statute Law (Restatement) Act 2002. In accordance with this act, the Law Reform Commission produces statute law restatements. A restatement is an administrative consolidation of an act, as amended subsequently, which is made available in printed or electronic form in a single text and is certified by the Attorney General as an up-to-date statement of the act in question as amended. The restatements are not legally binding; they can, however, be cited in court as prima facie evidence of the law set out in them.

By spring 2009, four restatements had been certified and published (for details see http://www.attorneygeneral.ie/slru/restatements.html).

NB 1: Legislation Directory

At present (apart from the limited number of restatements certified), in order to ascertain what legislation is in operation and what has been amended by subsequent enactments, the Office of the Attorney General publishes a Legislation Directory (http://www.attorneygeneral.ie/ slru/slru.html#Chronological).

NB 2: Consolidation Acts

A consolidating act 'consolidates' (i.e. in continental civil law terminology 'codifies') existing statute law on a particular subject matter by repealing and re-enacting acts and amendments to those acts in a single legally binding act. Special procedures relating to consolidation bills are set out in standing orders of the Parliament (http://www.attorneygeneral.ie/ slru/slru.html#statutelawrevisionproject).

Workflow The drafting is done by national bodies, while the publication and printing are done by the Uradni list company.

- **Publishing** Both the publishing body (documents issued by the National Assembly, National Council, Constitutional Court and some local authorities) and the Government Office for Legislation (government and ministerial acts and documents issued by authorities holding a public prerogative) are in charge of proofreading and editing.
 - The minimum period between reception of a draft and publishing the text is five days. This can be shorter if notification of publication is done beforehand, and in emergency situations.
 - The electronic and paper editions are derived from the same file and published at the same time. If there is a discrepancy, the electronic edition is authentic.

 - Since 1981, all data in the Lovdata systems have been encoded in Lovdata's own markup (BOKUS, which is similar to XML). This language was originally developed during 1979–81 and gives a complete description of the structure of the document. It can then be automatically converted to other markup or typesetting codes. The texts can be used for publishing or inclusion in the retrieval system.
 - No differentiated systems are used for primary and secondary (delegated) legislation.

Workflow The competent ministry sends the final texts for publication to the Lovdata Foundation, mostly by e-mail.

- **Publishing** Lovdata is in charge of proofreading and editing the text.
 - Usually, the publishing organisation publishes the text in the electronic edition of the Norsk Lovtidend the same day it receives the draft, but this could be done also the following Tuesday or Friday (at the latest).
 - The paper and electronic editions are derived from the same final text file, but are not published concurrently. The paper edition is published only 12 to 20 times a year, whereas the online edition is updated daily, or at the latest on Tuesdays/Fridays.


The common access point to legislation in the EU Member States

N-Lex, formerly Nat-Lex, is a one-stop shop for accessing legislation online in, currently (spring 2009), 23 Member States of the European Union. It provides a single user interface enabling the user to carry out searches in the national official online services, one per country. The type of target service differs. It is normally the (free-of-charge) official legal database containing non-consolidated and/or consolidated legislation; cf. the table on the next page.

A sub-project of the former EULEX projects (direct access to national legal provisions implementing EU directives) undertaken by the Publications Office of the European Union during the years 1999 to 2005, the N-Lex system became operational, although still on an experimental basis, in 2006. It offers the following features:

- for some countries, a common user interface (standard search mask) in 22 official languages;
- the adaptation (individualisation) of the search fields in the search screen according to the specific structure of the national database and its documents, by disabling the fields that are not usable in the particular national database;
- contextual assistance for the correct choice of search terms;
- integration of the Eurovoc tool (European Union multilingual thesaurus) into the search mask, enabling the user to choose search terms starting in her or his own language;
- for some countries, explanatory texts about the various national legal acts and institutions.

This guide is primarily intended for professional readers working in the field of legislative information but may also be of interest to those, inside or outside the legal profession, wanting to access European and foreign legislation.

The guide consolidates and makes publicly available the information on legislative sources in Europe (legal gazettes/official journals, official collections of consolidated legislation, official databases) which the Publications Office of the European Union has gathered in the framework of its activities as the secretariat of the European Forum of Official Gazettes. - the European Economic Area (EEA)
- the four Member States of the European Free Trade Association (EFTA).
