

Facilities and assistance



Our facilities are flexible and can be tailor-made to suit your needs. If you want to be at the centre of the action to closely follow what is happening in the European Parliament, we can host your production in our fully staffed and equipped broadcast, multimedia or radio studios located in Strasbourg and Brussels.

Our broadcast and multimedia positions allow you to interview a Member of the European Parliament (even remotely), record statements or host a livestream for social media. The positions are located close to the Hemicycles in Strasbourg and Brussels, but if you would like to report from a more dynamic perspective, our camera crews are available to follow you around the European Parliament premises.

Media can also use self-service positions where they can find basic equipment to record from the European Parliament with their own staff and equipment.

All our services need to be booked in advance as we work on a first-come first-served basis. Our services are free of charge (except for satellite transmission costs) for all media that report on European Parliament-related topics.

- Make-up facilities on site

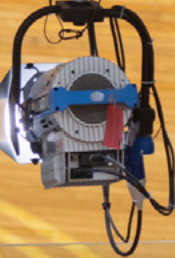

European Parliament Liaison Offices

The European Parliament is close to its citizens in every European Union country.

Across the European capitals, DG Communication is working to equip local European Parliament Liaison Offices with modest audiovisual facilities.

These offices support the Members of the European Parliament in the performance of their duties and can be used by media during debates and events organised by the Press Officers in the Member States.

Good to know

Media accreditation

Journalists, photographers and audiovisual teams who work for bona fide media organisations, and who are not holders of the joint EU–Institutional media badge, must apply for media accreditation in order to get access to the European Parliament premises: <https://jouregfo.secure.europarl.europa.eu/journalist-registration>

Photographers and camera operators, who are invited by members of the European Parliament or by the European Parliament’s services for special events, communication and promotional work, need to obtain a ‘non-media’ recording permit, which is issued at the media accreditation desk.

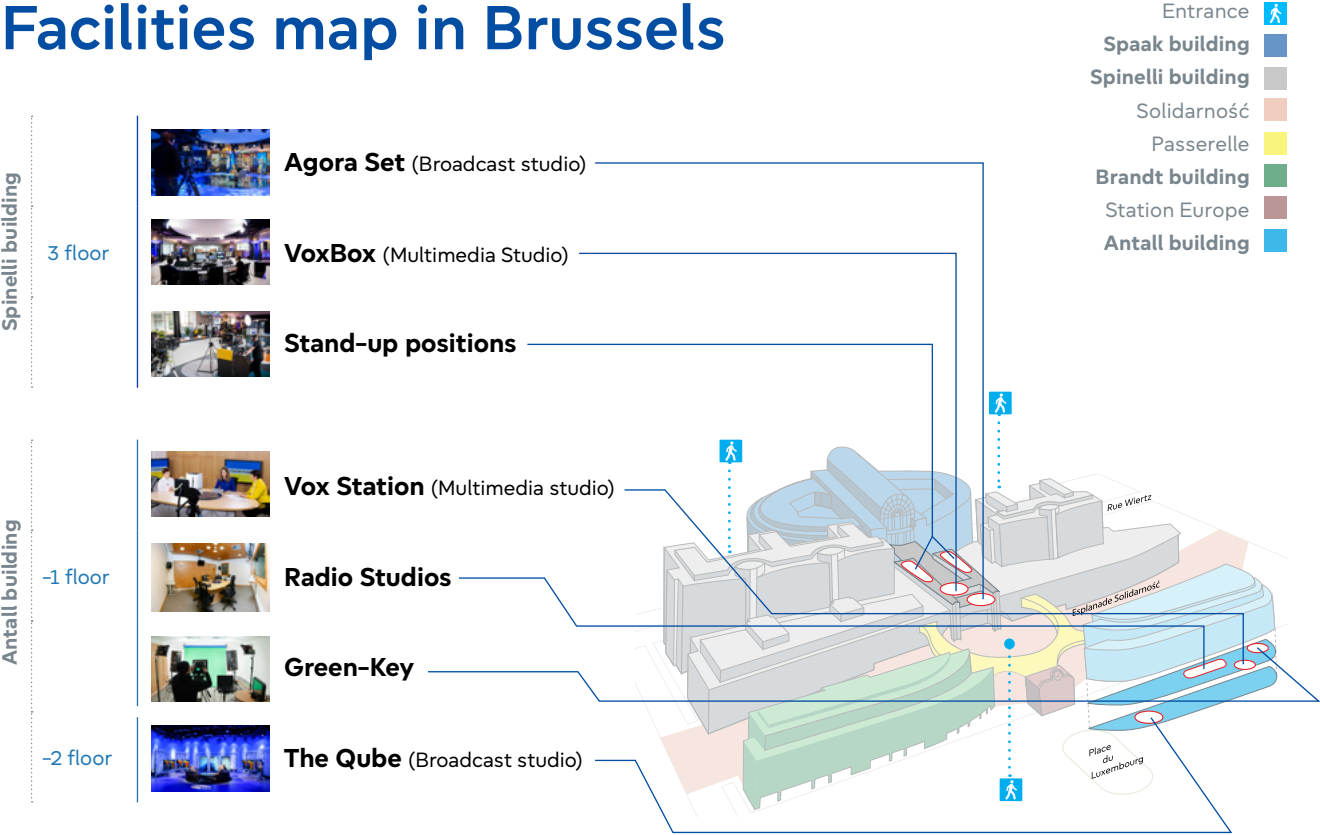

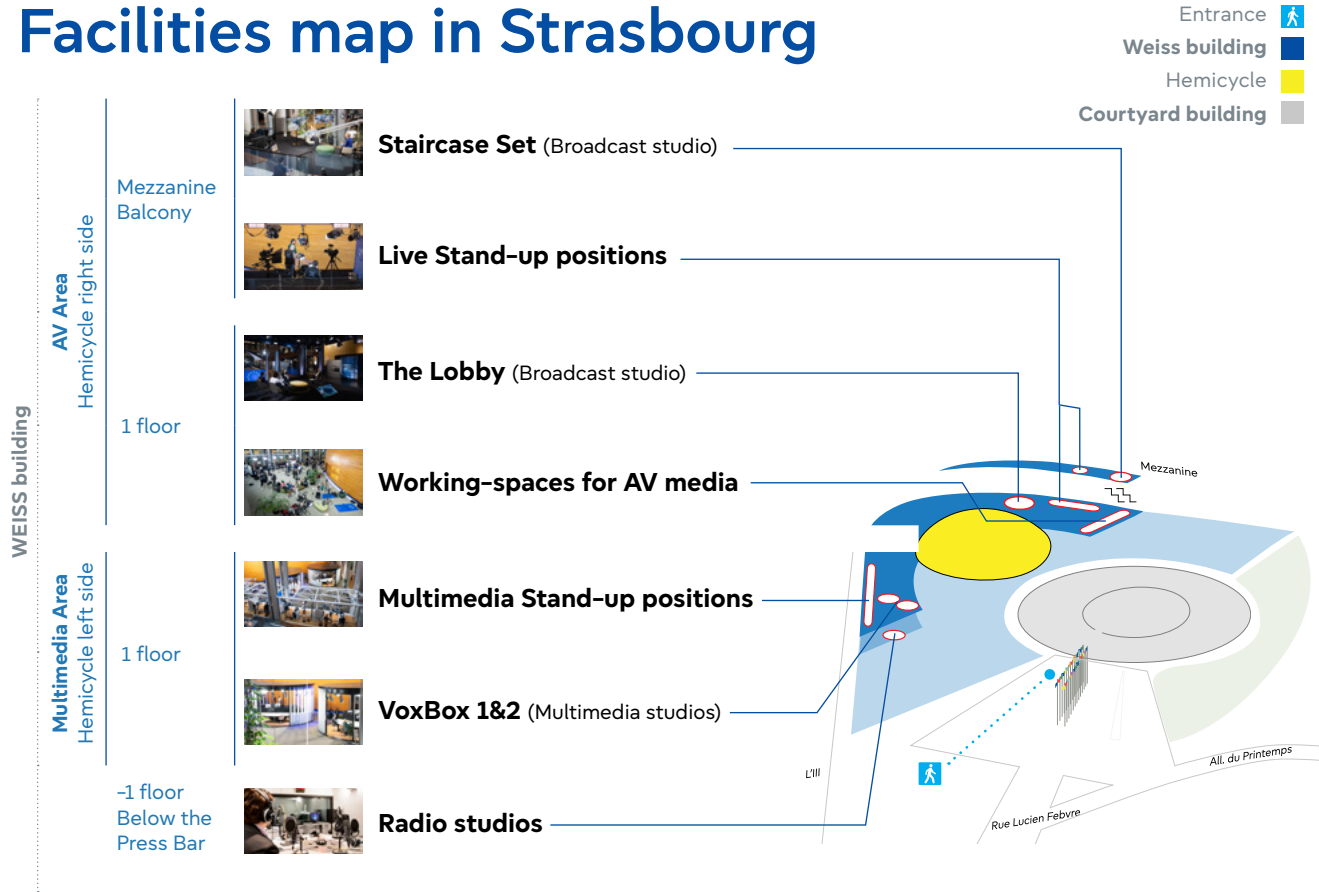
