

Mentoring for success: Your partner in academic quality



The Office for Professional Academic Development (OPAD) is dedicated to supporting UM academics across three interconnected streams of academic practice: teaching effectiveness, research development, and service and leadership.

Launched in academic year 2024/25, the Academic Mentoring Programme (AMP) provides a structured yet collegial space for early-career academics to map their professional development alongside an experienced academic mentor from a different Faculty, Institute, Centre or School. Participation is voluntary and the programme is intended as a supportive and developmental opportunity rooted in UM's values of collaboration and continuous improvement.

Feedback from participants in the pilot AMP highlights its impact in fostering a stronger institutional community through its interdisciplinary approach. Both mentors and mentees reported mutual benefits, including:

- Greater awareness of UM's organisational culture and resources;
- More confident navigation of academic and institutional processes;
- · Clearer career mapping and goal setting.

The pilot cohort included 26 early-career academics and 21 mentors from across UM.

Building on this success, OPAD launched another iteration of the AMP for interested academics during the current academic year.

The AMP is a key driver in enhancing academic quality and supports the professional growth and success of our academics.
