FORMATION OF WORKING GROUPS TO PREPARE DRAFTS AND STUDIES FOR THE FINAL REPORT (Cartography/W.6, W.7, W.9) (discussion continued)

The CHAIRMAN introduced General LOPER, representative of the PAIGH.

The Chairman pointed out that discussion on items III and VI of the project outlined by Mr. Schermerhorn (Cartography/W.7) would be resumed when the draft report had been submitted by Mr. Verlaine and Mr. Sincupietri.

Following the suggestion of Mr. BROWN, the CHAIRMAN requested Mr. Schermerhorn to prepare a review of existing organizations concerned with cartography, including a summary of their main functions as they had been discussed in the Committee. Brief reference could be made to the bearing of those organizations needs and interests on various aspects of the Committee's report to the Secretary-General. The Chairman agreed that the differences between the functions of those organizations and those of any co-ordinating organization within the United Nations should be clearly defined.

Mr. SIMONPIETRI pointed out that it would be necessary to include in the list existing regional organs of the Economic and Social Council whose interests included cartography. Mr. BROWN supported that view, and added that the Committee should inform the Secretary-General whether existing organizations could be expanded to meet cartographical problems and needs.

Mr. SCHERMERHORN thought that the difficulties in the way of effective coordination should be indicated in the Committee's report, and concrete recommendations made to remedy the situation.

The CHAIRMAN summarized the duties of the various working groups appointed to prepare studies on the project outlined by Mr. Schermerhorn (Cartography/W.7) as follows:

I State of world mapping

Mr. Hemple, Mr. Reading, Mr. Wright

II Consideration of the value of maps etc. (see also Cartography/W.9)

Mr. Brown

III Consideration of how interest in and realization of the need for the maps should be stimulated, and

VI Organization of international cooperation for achieving the objectives

Mr. Verlaine and Mr. Simonpietri

IV Review of existing organizations etc.

Mr. Schermerhorn

V General indication of the organization and cost to complete the mapping programme within a limited time and to keep the maps up to date

Mr. Randall

The Chairman added that Mr. Boggs, Mr. Peake and Mr. Leite de Castro had been requested to prepare a report on the problems connected with the organization of the services required within the United Nations Secretariat.

He expressed the hope that most of the draft reports would be available for consideration by the Committee on Tuesday, 29 March 1949.
