


Library Board

Institutions and individuals who are members of the OLH Library Partnership Subsidy (LPS) scheme are entitled to membership of the OLH Library Board.

The OLH Library Board (LB), in conjunction with the Academic Advisory Board and the OLH Directors (CEOs), determine the right of admission for journals to the OLH platform. This, in turn, means that these three entities collectively determine any year-on-year budget increases. The boards, except in exceptional circumstances, discuss these matters and vote through online channels.
