Extract from "Terms of Reference"

ISNI Consultation Groups

The Board of ISNI-IA may establish, dissolve and manage consultation groups for specific sectors to ensure that with respect to name identification:

- the needs of those sectors are accurately communicated to ISNI-IA,
- feedback on the utility and quality of ISNI-IA's services is available to ISNI-IA,
- cross-sector issues are analysed as appropriate and recommendations are made to ISNI-IA.

Consultation groups will be advisory in nature and their recommendations will not be binding on ISNI-IA.

The ISNI Music consultation group

- Has been the first such group established
- Essentially because of rapid growth in ISNI for Music
- And significant UNDER representation on our Board
- And other support structures
- Launched Feb 2019, three or four meetings since and list of "work items" already established
- Operates under agreed Terms of Reference doc
- Chaired by music & standards figure Paul Jessop

Modus operandi

- Setting up of the group was by informal invitation to interested parties, subsequently confirmed by emails of invitation from the Chair of ISNI-IA
- All meetings by phone conference, supplemented by email and document exchange
- Meetings approx. quarterly, convened and minuted by the Group's chair
- Agendas and work items suggested by Group members themselves
- Outputs then reported back to the ISNI-IA Board

What kinds of things are discussed?

- Initially, questions about the Group itself purpose, objectives, membership
- First major work item review of a document gathering a series of questions on Assignment Rules for music
- Using ISNI to identify music publishers, labels, studios
- A procedure for embargoed assignment
- Tackling duplicate assigments
- Improving ISNI documentation & presentation
- Initial, early assignment
- Interoperability with other identifiers and metadata standards
