²Community outreach may include community sensitization and dialogue on the UN Zero Tolerance Policy; the provision of information on how and where to report SEA, the accountability process and how to access victim assistance; capacity development and engagement of community leaders; and work to address stigmatization and the underlying factors that increase the risk of SEA.

³ Action: Taking Formal Complaint, Assessment, Referral to Victim's Assistance, Notification to: relevant entities, including judicial authorities and/or preservation of key evidence.

⁴ Psycho-social services/ Immediate medical assistance.

⁵ The categorization of "field" includes Missions and Country Offices.

⁷ The Policy on Human Rights Screening of UN Personnel applies to all types of personnel.
